CALL FOR APPLICATION **ERASMUS+ STUDENT MOBILITY FOR INTERNSHIPS**

WHAT is funded?

- Erasmus+ funds internships (compulsory, optional and research internships or internships in industry) with a duration of at least two full months up to a total of twelve months per study cycle (Bachelor, Master, PhD).
 - Students may complete several internships at different locations as long as the minimum duration of 2 full months without interruption at a host institution is observed and the total duration of 12 months per study cycle is not exceeded.
 - A minimum of 3 ECTS per month must be completed.
- Graduate internship:
 - Graduates who have been accepted for the internship before graduation are eligible to participate.
 - The application for Erasmus+ funding must be submitted to the International Office at least 3 months before graduation.
 - Participants must not be enrolled at a university, university of applied sciences or university before and at the start of the internship.
 - The mobility period must be at least 2 to a maximum of 12 full months. The mobility must be completed 12 months after graduation.
- All mobilities funded by Erasmus+ are added to the maximum duration of 12 months per study cycle.

WHEN is the application deadline?

- Applications can be submitted at any time, but must be submitted at least 3 months before the stay.
- The grant cannot be awarded retroactively.

WHO can apply for the grant?

- All active PMU students in the Bachelor's, Master's and PhD programs.
- Students receiving study grants can apply for Erasmus+ funding.
- Students with special needs can apply for additional funding (see p. 3).

What is NOT eligible for funding?

- Mobility in Austria

- Mobility at the Nuremberg Clinic
- Stay in the institutions of the European Commission
- Stay in the country of residence during studies

For non-Austrian students:

- Mobility in the home city or region is **not** eligible for funding.
- Mobility in the country of origin has the lowest priority in the allocation of funds. This means that the approval of funding depends on the available budget.

WHERE can mobility take place?

- In industry (e.g. companies, organizations, research institutions, hospitals, clinics, etc.) or at a higher education institution with a valid ECHE in the 26 EU Member States including their overseas countries and territories, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia and Turkey.

Mobility outside the EU:

- Mobility to the UK, Switzerland and other countries outside the EU is only possible to a very limited extent and depends on the available budget (approx. 2 places per year).

HOW does the application process work?

WHY is mobility important?

- A stay abroad supports, among other things, the acquisition of social, professional and methodological skills, as well as the development of global citizenship, the establishment of international networks and the broadening of horizons.

Possible top-ups (if applicable):

- Top-up for Green Travel: one-off grant of **EUR 50** for environmentally friendly travel by the following means of travel/transport:
 - Train (2ⁿ class ticket)
 - Bus
 - Carpool (if fellow travelers travel to the same partner institution).
- Top-up for students with fewer opportunities: grant of **EUR 250** per month for participant
 - with a physical impairment
 - with a chronic illness, if this results in increased financial expenditure during the stay abroadParticipants with children who take their children with them on their stay abroad.

Inclusion support (if needed):

- Erasmus+ covers additional costs incurred by participants with fewer opportunities (who already receive the top-up for fewer opportunities) in the course of the mobility or during the stay abroad and which cannot be covered by the top-up.
- Inclusion support is based on real costs.
- Must be applied for separately by participants at the Austrian National Agency via the International Office of the PMU.

For new applications and mobilities from 01.06.2024

- For host institutions (destination) that are less than 500 kilometers away from Campus Salzburg / Campus Nuremberg, mobility participants must use environmentally friendly means of transport.
- New funding rates apply. Information will be announced on the IO website as soon as possible.
